Alliance for College Readiness:

Alison Douglas

Summer 2010 was a busy time for the Alliance for College Readiness. The third year of the Summer Bridge program came with some disappointment and several promising successes. We were disappointed to find that despite the help of ECC's Marketing Department and despite Alison's best telemarketing skills, for the 3rd year, only 30% of eligible students enrolled in the Summer Bridge program. However, our disappointments ended there. The 23 Bridge students came from all four District 509 high school districts, and the Bridge faculty represented three high school districts as well as ECC. Intensive review classes addressed gaps in math and writing, and each class included additional contentspecific reading skill development. Of the 23 students enrolled in the Summer Bridge, 20 (86%) placed into college level reading, writing, or math at the end of the Bridge. ECC's Achieving the Dream data clearly shows that students' retention and goal completion increase as their remediation needs decrease. In this respect, the Summer Bridge has helped to increase the likelihood that these 23 students will reach their post-secondary goals. Equally important, the Summer Bridge provides hands-on professional development opportunities for its faculty*. This summer, the Summer Bridge faculty reported that the Bridge helped them develop skills and strategies they can use in their own classes and increased their ability to "bridge the gap" between high school and college expectations.

In addition to the Bridge, we have been continuing our networking to connect ECC's college readiness work with similar state and national efforts. Over the summer, we met with the Chair of the Illinois State P-20 Council and were able to share with him the work of the Alliance as well as learn from him the intended focus and direction of the State P-20 Council. We have also been planning the 2010 Fall Alliance for College Readiness meeting. In efforts to keep our members informed and proactive about the National Core Standards and their impact at high school and college levels, we have scheduled the State Superintendent of Schools, Chris Koch and the ICCB Vice President for Instruction and Policy to speak at the Fall meeting, scheduled for September 30, 2010 from 4:00 – 6:30 in the UBC.
