### Assessment Committee (Eric Long)

On April 4/26 SLAAC had first reading on a new updated outcome to replace our very outdated "Global Awareness" general education outcome. The old outcome read:

#### **Global Awareness Outcomes**

Students will demonstrate an increased understanding of global issues and different cultures.

The new outcome reads:

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Global and Multicultural Literacy

Students will demonstrate global awareness, cultural competency, and civic responsibility by being able to:

- Identify the historical, cultural, and socioeconomic perspectives of living in a global society.
- Describe, interpret and analyze culture in self and others.
- Take an active role in the community.

We feel that this outcome is much more comprehensive. In drafting the language, SLAAC was very conscience to use language that not only fit our institutional measurement needs, but combined language regularly used the ECC Strategic Plan, GIST, and MAGIC. Additionally, the outcome now reads much more like our other general education outcomes (which I attached in case it's been a while since you have read them...) I do believe all of our outcomes are now updated, improved, and been reviewed within the last three years.

## **Reading Outcomes**

Students will demonstrate academic reading literacy skills by being able to:

- Read and comprehend complex literary and informational texts independently and proficiently
- Identify what a text says explicitly and make logical inferences from it; cite specific textual evidence
- when supporting conclusions drawn from the text or conclusions drawn from a variety of textual sources
  Identify central ideas or themes within one or several tests; analyze ide or thematic development;

**Critical Thinking Outcomes** 

Students will demonstrate critical thinking skills by being able to:

- Form logical arguments by interpreting, analyzing and synthesizing multiple perspectives, experiences, assumptions and evidence
- Develop reasoned solutions to problems by evaluating issues, ideas, facts, and inferences
- Make ethical, creative and informed conclusions by using evidence and applying reasoning (Last reviewed/updated 2014)

Information & Technology Literacy Outcome

Students will demonstrate the ability to identify, acquire, evaluate, and utilize information to accomplish a specific purpose by being able to:

- Demonstrate proficiency in common office/academic software, internet navigation, and communication technologies
- Utilize technology appropriately to accomplish educational outcomes
- Identify and acquire information by using appropriate resources ethically, legally, and effectively
- Evaluate the reliability and validity of information and its source(s)
