# INSTITUTIONAL ADVANCEMENT AND ECC FOUNDATION REPORT MARCH 2019

#### Fundraising

As of February 25, 2019, the Foundation has raised \$567,502 in cash and pledges which is 71% to the FY19 goal of \$802,300.

Notable gifts from individuals, foundations and organizations during this period include:

- \$120,000 from the estate of Dr. William Pelz to create the endowed William Pelz Memorial Scholarship for students studying history or political science who are first in their family to attend college and show financial need.

- \$15,000 from the Danial Family Foundation to continue support of their Scholarship in truck driving.
- \$7,500 from Lundstrom Insurance to continue as a Premier Sponsor of the foundation's annual events.
- \$7,500 from Shales McNutt Construction to continue as a foundation annual Premier Sponsor.

### Scholarships and Grants to the College

As of February 1, 2019, the Financial Aid office had awarded \$261,425 (85%) of the \$306,690 scholarship spend allocation for the 2018-2019 academic year. As of that same date, 232 students had received 279 individual scholarship awards with an average total awards amount per student approximately \$940. The Financial Aid Office will continue to make new awards throughout the remainder of the academic year.

The 2019-2020 Scholarship Application is open! The Foundation Board will approve the spend allocation for the 2019-2020 academic year at its March 7 Board meeting.

### Alumni and Affinity Groups

Alumni relations has been collaborating and celebrating our alumni! Staff collaborated with Student Life on an event for Black/African-American students and alumni called "Which Road, Rich Road." 31 alumni and students participated. Additionally, Dean Follmann '77, the 2019 Distinguished Alumni Award honoree, was nominated for the Illinois Community College Trustees Association Distinguished Alumni Award.

The retiree committee will host a pre-show reception in the Safety-Kleen Gallery for the April 28 performance of The Blitz Randy Otto as Winston Churchill. Campus event details are routinely shared by volunteers as posts in the ECC Retirees closed Facebook Group for engagement and volunteer opportunities across campus.

### Foundation Board and Operational Updates

The Foundation and Institutional Advancement welcomed their newest staff members. Heather Collins, Director of Grants Research & Development is now reporting to Institutional Advancement as we look to increase ECC's strategic grant development process. Jennifer Garner joined the team as the new incumbent Foundation Coordinator.

Now fully staffed after a year-plus of transition, the foundation looks forward to completing its strategic planning process in June. To that end, a survey is being distributed to select stakeholders that represent the broader community. Feedback is essential to developing our mission. On April 12, the Foundation Board will host Betheny Reid of eAdvancement for a strategic planning session from 8 a.m. – 12 noon. ECC's Board of Trustees are cordially invited to join us.
