RECOGNITION OF VISITORS & GUESTS

Heidi Eaton: Luis Martinez welcomed Heidi and invited her to discuss her sabbatical and a proposal that has evolved based on her work. The New Faculty Hire Orientation program would benefit from additional structure and support. She is committed to ensure faculty play a key leadership role and is recommending college wide participation from each division, including full time and unit adjunct faculty, librarians, support staff, and administration. She is seeking input from the senate and shared that she has full support from the Board of Trustees, Dr. Sam and Rose DiGerlando.

The Senate is also supportive of this proposal and offered assistance to draft bylaws for the committee to be established to ensure sustainability of the program. She was encouraged to clarify the role and requirements of the chair for inclusion in the bylaws. It was requested that she submit the names of faculty to the senate for approval. The Senate congratulated Heidi on her efforts thus far and encouraged her to proceed with the project.

Report

The meeting was held at John A Logan College in Carterville, Illinois. President of the college-Dr. Mike Deith discussed the challenges in Illinois higher education. He expects spring enrollment to be down and believes the cost versus the perceived value of higher education is responsible and will be an issue for us all.

Discussion was held about the transition from high school to college, college readiness and remediation. Also, student roadmaps/pathways was mentioned as important.

Dr. Valerie Berko, Dean of Academic Affairs presented. Barriers to meeting the 2025 goal were considered as well as the benefits of TRIO. Also discussed was cohort groupings and the benefits/challenges of dual credit offerings.

Lieutenant Governor Sheila Simon joined us to discuss higher education in the state. She recently visited all community colleges and public four year institutions in the state. Discussion was had about: the Illinois political system, supporting higher education, AP scores, number of school districts, fracking, and the pension situation.

The community college caucus met and discussed bringing in someone from the Illinois Community Faculty Association to meet with the caucus.

It was reported that SURS has developed a 27 page analysis of the pension bill; it is very complex and has many components. It will be sent out to the council as soon as it's available.

The Curriculum Committee met nine times this fall, and had a quorum each time.

The Committee re-elected Leticia Starkov as the Vice-Chair, a position she has held for a number of years. Joe Rosenfeld was elected Chair at the final meeting in the spring.

We have kept the Senate informed of our activities by providing approved minutes throughout the semester.

A complete list of activities is included in this report (Pp. 2- 6). It has been a successful ½ year.

I would point three things. First, three committee meetings went over the scheduled meeting time due to either issues with a proposal or the sheer volume of proposals. In every case both the faculty and the support staff assigned to the committee hung in there until the agenda was completed.

Second, we have been encouraging initiators to ensure that they understand the system-wide impact of the changes being proposed. There were multiple instances when this occurred and either avoided inter-departmental conflict or promoted inter-departmental cooperation.

Third, as has been in the past, the support staff members have been awesome. They would make any chairperson look good.

In the upcoming semester, we will be reviewing the By-Laws as required by the By-Laws.
