Kimberly Tarver, ECCFA President; Ellie Swanson, ECCFA 1st VP; and Baudelaire Ulysse, ECCFA 2nd VP attended the Illinois Federation of Teachers Convention. The convention takes place every three years to consider proposed amendments to the IFT Constitution and resolutions proposed for adoption.

The convention was chaired by IFT President, Dan Montgomery. Speakers included Sen. Dick Durbin and Governor J.B. Pritzker.

Senator Durbin spoke of the importance of education in our state and our country and the need to fund it effectively. Gov. Pritzker spoke primarily about the fair tax initiative that will be on the ballot in the upcoming election. He emphasized the importance of this for education and that extensive cuts would be necessary without the additional funding the fair (progressive) tax will bring.

Dual Credit

Dual credit negotiations between ECCFA and the ECC administration are ongoing. This semester some ECC courses are being taught at District 509 high schools by high school teachers. Students will receive college credit for these courses. The primary issues in question are what tasks will be required of ECC faculty liaisons and what the compensation for these tasks will be.

Discussions are moving forward, though slowly. ECCFA chief negotiator is Patrick Gordon. Members of the team are: Ryan Kerr, Dave Reich, Nicole Scherger, and Ellie Swanson. Kim Tarver is an ex-officio member.
